Explore Together - Sunday evening, 9th August (7pm): We will be trying out Explore Together, a new Scripture Union tool for exploring the Scriptures together in ways that suit each of us best, so we can hear from God and learn from each other. There will be six zones around the church building: Colour (learning by seeing), Listening (hearing), Chat (interacting and thinking aloud), Word (reading and writing), Busy (hands-on, "doing") and Quiet (reflecting). Following an introduction (presenting a Bible passage and praying) we can each explore in one or more of these zones, seeking to answer some general guestions and explore the text together. This time the passage will be Matt 5:13-16 (salt and light). At the end we will share what we've found and give thanks. The format is intended to be totally inclusive and to break down barriers. In this evening service we're testing it out and we may try it out in a morning service (or some other setting) soon. Consider bringing children along or anyone you know who might enjoy it. Jon Stammers would like to get a team together to prepare things and model involvement in each of the zones - it won't be as good if it's just him trying to do it all! So far Penrallt has contributed \pounds 5,455 to this scheme.

Focus on ...



France

(Peter & Rachel Calvert, France Mission)

Why plant churches in France? Aren't there already plenty?

It's true that the Catholic Church has a long history in France. And Calvin, the sixteenth century protestant reformer, was French by birth. But today the overwhelming majority of French people have never had the opportunity to hear the gospel in form which makes sense to them, or to see it lived out in a community of local believers. Recent efforts to bear witness to Christ in France have shown that one of the most effective ways to have a lasting impact is to plant new churches. New believers, born again by the power of the Holy Spirit, and functioning together locally as the body of Christ, make the gospel visible and comprehensible.

France has, on average, one evangelical church for every 30,000 people. (That's roughly the population of Bangor and Caernarfon added together). However, the churches are very unevenly spread. There are many regions where evangelical churches are few and far between, and many sub-cultures which are relatively unreached by the gospel. French evangelicals have prayerfully set the goal of one church for every 10,000 inhabitants... that means planting 4200 more churches!

But where do you fit in?

We're not French. But in our late teens / early twenties (before we were married), we were both challenged by the spiritual needs of this beautiful country. After training at All Nations Christian College in England, we joined a French Church planting network called *France Mission*. For the last ten years, we've been leading a church plant in the industrial town of Saint-Étienne, an hour from Lyons. This summer, we are moving to a town called Blois in the centre of France. The



France Mission church on the council estate in the North of Blois has plans for a new church plant in the town centre. We're not sure yet what form this will take, but we're excited about getting to know the Christians in the area, discerning the way forward with them and getting stuck in!

And where do we fit in?

We're really grateful to have had Penrallt as one of our partner churches over the last few years. Thank you to those who have prayed for us, and for your warm welcome whenever we come to visit. We also enjoy hearing how you are serving God and reaching out in your own community, which is in some ways a very different to ours, but in other ways quite similar. We'll be keeping you up to date with the new project in Blois, and who knows... maybe some of you will be able to come over some time and see for yourselves what God is doing in France!
