Street Pastors

Serving around the UK and beyond

Back in January, our <u>Focus article</u> was about the work of Bangor Street Pastors. This time we will take a slightly broader look at Street Pastors and related initiatives around the world.

There are a number of Street Pastor initiatives across the UK and further afield, all working under the banner of the Ascension Trust, a Christian charity that has been operating for 30 years to promote effective engagement of the Church with society.

There is probably no such thing as a typical SP initiative, as they operate in a wide variety of different situations, ranging from inner cities to rural villages, and adapt themselves to local conditions. What they have in common is that the members of the team are volunteers from local churches (at least 4 churches are required to work together to form any SP initiative), dedicated to impartially showing the love of God to their communities through listening, caring and helping. Generally the work takes place on the streets, usually at night time, but in some places they go into pubs, clubs or other places to chat to people and help them as needed and sometimes they operate during the day.

In addition to street pastors, Ascension Trust run several other initiatives such as School & College Pastors, Rail Pastors and Response Pastors. The first two of these are probably quite obvious from the names, as they work respectively in schools and colleges or on trains (though actually School/College Pastors do most of their work outside the school gates and Rail Pastors work in stations as well). As with street pastors they would generally have fairly regular patterns of when and where they operate. Response Pastors are slightly different, as they are trained to be able to offer an extra level of physical and emotional support in times of crisis or disaster.

A number street pastors from around the UK took part in extra patrols in London to help support the crowds present for the coronation of King Charles earlier this year. None of the Bangor team joined in directly with that, but Magnus was one of many more street pastors and prayer pastors forming a remote prayer team to receive real-time updates (via WhatsApp) from the patrol teams and to pray for them as they worked. Things generally seemed to run smoothly but the teams were able to help several people, including at least two families with missing children (one of them was later reported as safely found, no further news was given of the other one).

Prayer is, of course, a key to all that Street Pastors and related initiatives do (and all that we do as Christians). So please pray for them.
