

God's goodness is running after me

Jonah chapter 1 is often seen as a story of Jonah running away from God. It is perhaps more about God running after Jonah. Jonah understandably decided to quit his job as prophet when God called him to go to Nineveh. This Assyrian capital was the epitome of cruelty and power and Assyria was one of the enemies of God's people. Jonah often prophesied against his enemies but God wants Jonah to learn about His compassion for all peoples — even his enemies. So God pursues Jonah. First God sends a storm. Then God sends a pagan captain to encourage him to pray. Then God sends a group of pagan sailors to challenge him, encourage him in his faith, to help him and to show him compassion. Jonah then gets to a point where he has given up on himself. However, Jonah now wants to save these pagan sailors who are on a journey of turning to God themselves. In Jonah's unique situation this means persuading them to throw him overboard in a storm! God wouldn't ask anyone to do that today — because the unique event that this foreshadows (the crucifixion of Jesus) has now happened and through the cross of Jesus Christ, God saves us.

God has not given up on Jonah. He sends a fish to save him. He has more to teach him. God has more ways that He wants to transform Jonah. God, in His compassion, has a plan. He wants Jonah to deliver a message which will result in many people being saved. In spite of Jonah being unmerciful, unwilling, and ungracious, God never gives up on Jonah.

God also wants to use us to the glory of his name and to transform us and our world. It's not always plain sailing and it's often very challenging. But God's love pursues us. Our response together (as we sing in the song 'Your goodness is running after me'): "with my life laid down, I'm surrendered now, I give You everything". We seek to trust in God, be filled with his Holy Spirit, and to love and follow Jesus in loving others.
