

Happy New Year. Hope you have a whale of a time!

Praying God's blessing for us all as we continue to seek to glorify him in our lives and at Penrallt in the new year!

Anyone who has been to the Natural History Museum can't fail to have been impressed with the huge skeletons or life-sized models of whales hanging from the ceiling. Whenever I see them, it always reminds me of Jonah. I believe it actually happened, and also — what a powerful story! Story is such a powerful medium of communication.

So to start the new year, we turn to the Old Testament story of Jonah. It's good to look at different parts of the Bible — we need all of scripture to help us in our understanding of God. Jonah was perhaps one of the most successful missionaries in the Old Testament. He walked straight in to an infamous, hostile city. He called people to repentance, they 'believed God', and turned to Him. Jonah's own life was full of faults — running away from what he knew God wanted him to do and not having a good understanding of God's compassion. But we can be encouraged that God used him, and we can learn from his repentance and his obedience (eventually!) and from the insight he was given into God's heart of mercy, compassion and love.

The largest presence in the book of Jonah is not the prophet, or even the 'huge fish', it's God. "The LORD, the LORD, the compassionate and gracious God, slow to anger, abounding in love and faithfulness. (Exodus 34v6)"

Our focus for the new year is the greatest missionary ever: Jesus. Jesus never sinned. He fully obeyed God and was full of compassion and grace. He was swallowed up by death and yet burst out of the grave. He calls us, and many, to repentance. By his death, he gives us access to forgiveness, peace, eternal hope and life to the full to the glory of God. Praise Jesus!

Gobaith Môn

Serving in the secondary schools of Anglesey

Gobaith Môn is one of Scripture Union's Local Mission Partners. It was established around 10 years ago by Christians on Anglesey. Gobaith Môn aims to bring together Christians from all denominations to bring hope to the youth of the Island, by encouraging and developing youth work in schools, churches and communities.



Over the past decade, Gobaith Môn Schools Workers have been welcomed into local secondary schools in Holyhead, Menai Bridge, Bodedern, and Amlwch. Activities have included assemblies, collective worship, RE lessons, PSE lessons and facilitating the formation and running of the school ambassadors and council. Gobaith Môn also have an office in the school in Holyhead, giving the opportunity for the students to interact with schools workers on a personal level. As a result of this contact they are able to ask questions about issues raised in the assemblies, RE lessons and PSE lessons.

Gobaith Môn have also run a monthly youth event to bring together local young Christians and encourage them to deepen their faith.

The Covid-19 pandemic and the recent problems with RAAC in school buildings have both had an impact on students' learning experiences and the work of Gobaith Môn. Amy Turner, Gobaith Môn's schools worker, is returning to work 3 days a week in the new year, following maternity leave, and picking up with the regular activities.
