

During the devotional at the beginning of a meeting recently, we were invited to reflect on joy and share our experiences of joy. This followed on from Psalm 66 which begins: "Shout for joy to God, all the earth!". Thinking of my own experiences of joy and taking these to God was both spiritually uplifting and emotionally therapeutic. One of the 5 ways to wellbeing is to "Take notice: remember the simple things that give you joy". We came across this recently in our training for our renew wellbeing drop-in café — and I reckon it works!

In terms of my own recent experiences of joy, I was immediately drawn to the joy that I had recently seen on TV news. Joy on the faces of some refugees from Ukraine. They had come here to Wales and were now able to celebrate the birthday of one of the children with their new hosts. There were snippets of their story in the broadcast, and I was then struck by the palpable joy. A sense of relief and release of joy which was on their faces. What a great joy for them to be able to celebrate this birthday in safety and security. An oasis of celebration after a difficult journey. We pray for them and for all refugees that they find peace and healing as they create new foundations for the future.

I was also drawn to the joy that I had gleaned from the Bible as a surprisingly strong theme as we've worked through our current series in Acts 3–6. This early community of believers had an irrepressible sense of joy. Joy that they had encountered divinity in and through Jesus. Joy that they were saved and reconciled to God. Joy that God was active in and through their community. That God was bringing healing, salvation, grace, revelation and love to them and to any who would receive the good news of Jesus.

In thinking about worship CS Lewis wrote, "I think we delight to praise what we enjoy because the praise not merely expresses but completes the enjoyment".

Morning Services This Month

Our morning services continue to be in a hybrid format, in the building and on Zoom. Please see the website for up to date information about services and any Covid regulations which may be in force. The link for the Zoom meeting and recordings of past services, where available, are also on the website.

Morning services start at 10:30am on Sundays. Children and young people go out part way through the service for Sunday school (Primary school / up to 11) or *Deeper* (Secondary school / 11 – 17); there are also crèche facilities available if you have very young children. During the school summer holiday (from 24th July) the children and young people will remain in the service; activities will be provided for the children and the services will be aimed to engage the young people as well as the adult congregation; parents will be able to take their children through and use the crèche toys in the hall if they need to.

Evening Services

Following a successful start in May and June, we are continuing to trial some different evening service formats until the Summer holidays. Some might work, some might not, but we are looking at using that Sunday evening slot to be of use to as many people as possible. Each of these services will start at 6pm and most are expected to last around an hour to an hour and a half. Note that unlike our morning services, these will not be recorded or broadcast on Zoom. Also, there will not be an evening service on the first Sunday of the month; instead we will continue our fellowship activities in the afternoons, though in July this will be replaced by the Cytûn *Praise at the Pier* service (see below).

Colm & Catherine Ó Brolcháin Serving with OM Ireland

"My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness"

Dearest friends,

What a year we have all seen! We are grateful for the opportunity to share what the Lord has been building since our last report. We serve with Operation Mobilisation in Ireland. Colm drives a Big Red Bus as an evangelism tool and Catherine supports the team as a pastoral carer.

We took the opportunity to take an 8 week sabbatical for the first time and we saw the Lord bring us into a place where some issues were revealed but we also gained a deeper revelation of Jesus' sufficiency. Of course we did have some downtime; quite a number of visits to cafés for tea and cake, finding some new walks and a wonderful time at a cottage by the sea in Wexford.

First, some exciting news! We are delighted to tell you that OM in the UK has invited Colm and the Big Red Bus to be part of their 2 week outreach for the Commonwealth Games in Birmingham from July 26th to August 9th. The bus has been invited again by the Community Council in Carna Connemara, to be part of the *Féile Mhic Dara*, a two day celebration of Saint Mhic Dara the patron saint of the Fishermen in that area. The bus went once before and many, many people had faith conversations and received New Testaments. It is miraculous that the village committee has invited this blatantly Christian bus to their festival, Praise God!

It will be "all hands on deck" here at the office, we are really excited that we will have more teams coming in July and August, there is always such a buzz on site as we train and care for them before we launch them out to work with the Irish Churches! We have a team from "Exodus", returning to us after a successful initial partnership last summer with the Exodus Organisation in Northern Ireland. A team of 8 teenagers are coming in July to help a small church in Roscommon run a Bible Kid's camp. We have another team of 8 joining us for the last week of July, all from Switzerland. They will serve a small church in Mullingar to help with evangelism during the National traditional Irish music festival, the *Fleadh Cheoil.* The streets and venues will be full of people and at previous events there were lots of opportunities to share faith.

Catherine continues to come alongside about 30 adults on our team, some are singles but most are families. She visits them in their own homes or for

coffee in their nearest town. She is also part of any resolution needed in any conflicts that arise. Praise God as we see people willing to seek the Lord, submit to His word and move forward in a more Godly manner.

One stressor for many people on our team is the need for visa approval to remain in Ireland and it has been a joy to see the Lord making a way; one team member has just been granted Irish Citizenship and two families are now eligible to apply to be Irish citizens
