♦ Anglesey Prayer Walk 2015 Taith Weddi Môn

Saturday 20th June

This year's Anglesey Prayer Walk is planned for Saturday 20th June. There will be organised prayer walks in Menai Bridge, Llangefni and Amlwch. Contact details and information about the walks will be circulated in due course. Any queries in the meantime, please e-mail angleseyprayerwalk@hotmail.co.uk. In the evening there will be a meeting at the Town Hall in Llangefni, with refreshments from 5:00pm and a Celebration starting at 6:00pm.

Bible Unzipped aims to unpack Scripture with those interested in learning more than can be offered in a Sunday sermon. It also equips those leading in the church with some tools for studying and teaching from the Bible. We meet monthly on the second Saturday morning at Rhos-on-Sea URC from 9:30am to 1pm. Each morning includes three sessions. The course is free. This month: Learning to Love Proverbs (by Peter Cousins), Preaching in the modern world (part 2) by Rob Beamish and The Bible Text (by Julia Bartholomew).

♦ Car Parking

Free parking is available on Sundays in Fron Heulog (the School of Healthcare Sciences) behind the Catholic church. The car park next door to Penrallt is now pay & display with no special rates for the disabled. Morrisons are happy for you to park in their car park on Sunday mornings and do your shopping after the service provided you register your car registration number at their information desk beforehand. Morrisons say they switch the cameras off to make the car park available to us on Sunday/weekday evenings after 6pm.

- \diamond **Christian Aid Week:** Thank you to all who worked and contributed to Christian Aid Week. Penrallt collected £1,586.17. Thank you all.
- ♦ **Church Lunch:** We will host a church lunch on **Sunday 7th June**. Please bring enough buffet style 'finger food' for yourselves and one or two others.
- ♦ **Church Walk** *Monday 15th June 10:30am Along ancient "Sarn Helen" into a hidden valley and over the hills to medieval Castell Dolwyddelan.*

From Betws y Coed take the A470 to Dolwyddelan and at the crossroads turn left. Meet at 10:30am opposite Dolwyddelan church, a short distance from the crossroads. The walk is 6 miles and follows the Sarn Helen Roman Road along Cwm Penamnen before climbing out of the valley up a steep wooded hillside (in places 1 in 3 - we'll take our time over this section!). The woodland ends at the top of the climb where there is a panoramic view across open moorland to Moel Siabod, the Glyderau and the Snowdon group. The walk continues gently down to Roman Bridge returning to Dolwyddelan on well defined paths and tracks passing Castell Dolwyddelan on our way. Please bring a picnic lunch, and wear waterproof walking boots as, after rain, some sections could be quite wet underfoot. Toilets are available in Dolwyddelan and Betws y Coed. ♦ Cytûn (Churches Together) at Bangor Carnival: Saturday 6th June

This year we will be offering craft for children, a prayer space and a baby change facility, plus Open the Book/Agor y Llyfr will be presenting Bible stories through drama at intervals during the afternoon. (No tea and coffee this year.) Lots of helpers are required, please:

- 1. Erecting the tent and packing it away, 5-7pm on Friday 5th and Saturday 6th June
 - a. Someone with a robust 8ft trailer to bring the tent down from Moelyci to the Carnival field on Beach Road for 5pm on Friday and take it back at around 7pm on Saturday.
 - b. Six able-bodied persons to erect the tent 5-7pm on Friday.
 - c. Six able-bodied persons to dismantle the tent 5-7pm on Saturday.

- 2. Helping with activities in the tent on Saturday: Please can each church provide at least 2 people for one hour between noon and 5pm, to help either with the prayer corner or with the crafts. Everyone should be prepared to engage passers-by in conversation and hand out Cytûn leaflets as required. If you want to volunteer please contact Sarah Jackson ASAP.

This month we are due to visit Plas Garnedd on **Sunday 7th June** (please see weekly news sheets or check with the church office for confirmation).

Rough Sleepers

The church's policy is not to give money directly to the rough sleepers in Upper Bangor. Be warned that some of them can be aggressive. You will find brown envelopes in the porch for a gift that will buy meal vouchers which are distributed to rough sleepers by the Cathedral. So far Penrallt has contributed £5,455 to this scheme.

Focus on...

The Ó Brolcháin Family

Serving with Operation Mobilisation, Ireland

Many folk have joined Penrallt Church since we left Wales in 2000! So we thought we should give you some background intel on us!

We are an Irish family with three grown children; Ciara (who worshipped with you from 2008-2011), Sinéad and Ruairí. Only Ruairí remains living with us at home, he sits his final school exams in June this year, in fact we have him strapped down in front of his desk until his last exam on 17th June!

We worshipped with you all the way back in 1991 to 2000 and we try and visit every year because by God's grace you have been faithfully supporting us for many years. We hope to visit again in the Autumn when Ruairí will be settled into college...dates to be finalised! The Lord led us to join the work of Operation Mobilisation (OM) in Ireland in September 2008, that meant a move of 80 miles and new schools, church and friends. Our plan was to serve Him for one year but we soon realised that the Lord wanted us to remain serving Him indefinitely. Colm began and continues to serve as the mechanic for our car fleet - over 30 vehicles now! He is also one of the drivers of our 'Big Red Bus'. When he goes out with teams that are sharing the Gospel, Colm has discovered that the Lord has given him the desire and ability to share his faith. He has grown in confidence about how to bring everyday conversations around to debating and sharing about God.

Catherine has had lots of different jobs over the seven years, but has handed them on to new team members as our team has grown-from 15 in 2008 to 48 in 2015. Her main role is pastoral now as we have established a 'People Care' ministry; which means practical, spiritual and emotional support for our team.

The areas where God is presently using our team include: Faith programmes to primary and secondary schools, support for youth clubs, general street evangelism, use of drama and the arts in various ways, small teams to live and serve at 4/5 churches around Ireland. We are joined by teams from churches outside Ireland who come on tailor-made outreaches and we have repeating outreaches: Impact Ireland (July), the music festival in Sligo (August), the Horse Fair (September), the National Ploughing Championship (October) and of course St Patrick's challenge (March). Our challenge to you is... will you come to serve for a few days or a week with us in Ireland?

- You speak English, and so do we (after a fashion!)
- · We are only across the water.
- You will never be the same again; God will teach you so about himself as you step out in faith.

Just come for a week, we are sure it can be organised if you are willing, as individuals or as a group; you'll be encouraged and so will we!!

Looking forward to seeing you this Autumn.
