

Planning in faith – Praying for and supporting Rebecca

Do you find that it's difficult to plan for warm summer activities when it's raining? It doesn't inspire you with confidence watching water dripping down the windows and when you can hear the rain too! Perhaps you're making plans and hoping that the social distancing measures or travel restrictions will be eased? It continues to be a difficult and frustrating time for many people. We continue to pray for many who are hurting at this time.

Happily, making plans with God is a little bit better. We can't necessarily see everything at the time, but God gives us a vision. God then slowly opens up a way to get to the vision he showed us. We respond by stepping out in faith. Step by step. We look to our God who is faithful. We can also look back and see how God has provided for us and led us in the past. This builds our faith to carry on. Last year we felt led to employ a youth worker. It felt very much like stepping out in faith. In February this year, God led Rebecca to us and she starts this month. We are delighted that Becca is going to be joining the team to lead the youth work. We hope that joining in the summer will enable her to meet many of the young people and people in the church and in the wider community while coronvirus restrictions are eased. We pray for growth of discipleship in our young people, for young people to come to salvation, we pray for young people outside of the church to become more open towards God and to the church. We pray for all of these things!

We already have a great youth team, and the whole team are looking forward to Becca's contribution. But we can all ask ourselves how we can support Becca and our youth work too. Becca will need our support, our prayers, and she will need many volunteers in many different areas too if this is going to bear fruit.

Momentum Wave of Prayer 2021

Momentum is usually an annual joint conference for Baptists in Wales who are part of BUGB (Baptist Union of Great Britain) and BUW (Baptist Union of Wales). This year, instead of



organising a conference, a 'wave of prayer' has been planned which will move across all of Wales going to a different region in Wales.



The 'wave' started at Pentecost with a video from Ilston, which was the place of the first Baptist Church in Wales in 1649 and will move clockwise around all of Wales. At time of writing, it has been to Pantygwydr Baptist Church, Swansea where people gathered to pray and is now in Haverfordwest where people are now gathering to pray. It comes to Bangor with our hybrid event live in the building and online on 9th June.

People all over Wales

will be praying that God will change the atmosphere. That we will see God's kingdom come in our communities. That we will see the broken healed, the hurting comforted, and people reconciled to God through salvation and new life. That we will get fresh vision for what that could look like locally and all over Wales. There is also

the hope that Christians in Wales will become more aware of one another's needs. To facilitate this, each hub meeting will receive prayer from the previous hub meeting and prayers will be written to send to the next hub.

So please join us in person or on zoom on Wednesday 9th June at 7pm. We'll also have a brief slot at our church family get-together on Rhosneigr beach on 6th. Please pray for the
