How to pray for a new prime minister...

For some people reading this article, this title could come with an exclamation mark at the end. For others it could come with a question mark at the end. For others it will be received as a 'how to' information guide. Applying the Bible and reflecting on this, I believe that we should consider all 3 of these approaches. God is relevant to every part of our lives — including our politics. There will be a variety of political opinions — many held passionately. I hope we will all agree that we should pray.

Firstly, the exclamation mark. It's been a tumultuous time in Westminster creating a significant amount of instability. Paul writes to Timothy that we should pray for those in authority (1 Tim. 2v1–4) "that we may live peaceful and quiet lives in all godliness and holiness".

Secondly, the question mark. It's ok and good to question. In our democracy we have more opportunity to speak out than Paul and Timothy had in their times. We are not asked to pray in order to make us politically affirming, sessile and dormant. The prophets and the book of James remind us that we should challenge injustice in society and speak up for the poor and the needy. I welcome that we have our first Asian prime minister. We also have our first Hindu prime minister. We can still pray. The God of the Bible is presented as the only God and the sovereign God. God can work through individuals in authority and through governments whether they acknowledge Him as God or not. Paul and Timothy's government was not Christian when Paul wrote that they should be praying for those in authority. Either way, the government and the prime minister both need our prayers.

So how can we pray? We can pray that government and the prime minister will make good and right decisions. We can pray for wisdom. We can pray that they will remember the poor and needy in our country and overseas. We can pray

Morning Services This Month

Our morning services continue to be in a hybrid format, in the building and on Zoom. Please see the website for up to date information about services and a link for the Zoom meeting, as well as recordings of past sermons.

Morning services start at 10:30am on Sundays. Children and young people go out part way through the service for Sunday school (Primary school / up to 11) or *Deeper* (Secondary school / 11 - 17); crèche facilities are also available for younger children.

Communion will be served in a Covid-safe manner to those in the building. Those on Zoom will need bread and wine (or equivalent) to fully participate.

Mark is the minister of the Lighthouse Community Church in Llandudno; John is our minister; Amy works with Gobaith Môn (the subject of last month's <u>Focus</u> <u>article</u>). The sermons on 6th and 20th November are part of our ongoing series looking at the early church in Ephesus.

Service Videos

Since we started broadcasting our morning services during the covid pandemic, we have made recordings of the services available online. These have served, and continue to serve, a useful purpose but we lack the necessary resources (principally time) to produce videos of an acceptable quality to be publicly available. From mid-November the full service videos will no longer be listed on YouTube or our own website. The recordings themselves will still be available; please contact the church office if you would like a link to them. Videos of sermons will remain directly available and the services will still be broadcast on Zoom.

Evening Services This Month

Our evening services continue with a varied programme of formats.

Evening services start at 6pm on Sunday and take place in the chapel unless otherwise noted, usually lasting around an hour to an hour and a half. Unlike our morning services, they are not recorded or broadcast on Zoom. Also, there will not be an evening service on the first Sunday of the month; instead we continue our fellowship activities in the afternoons (including a walk at Newborough on 6th November — see next page for details).

We take up an offering during our morning services.
