Identity. Who am I?

This month we enter a new sermon series on Christian identity. Who am I? Who am I like? Who do I want to be? Who do I want to be like?

Having a strong sense of Identity in our pluralistic culture is important. The definition of the word 'identity' in the Collins Dictionary perhaps encapsulates the struggle faced by people in Britain today as they wrestle with this. It is both (1) "the state of having unique identifying characteristics held by no other person or thing", and at the same time it is (2) "the state of being the same as a person or thing described or claimed". Identity is a mix of something that we are and something that we choose. Psychologytoday.com states that "identity encompasses the memories, experiences, relationships, and values that create one's sense of self." And that "new facets are developed and incorporated into one's identity over time".

The Bible has a lot to say about Christian Identity. We are "made in the image of God" (Gen 1v27), we are "God's handiwork" (Eph 2v10), we are "loved" (Eph 3v17) "born again" (John 3v3), we are "citizens of heaven" (Phil 3v20), we are "children of God" (John 1v12), "born of the spirit" (John 3v5), "temples of the Holy Spirit" (1 Cor 6v19), "anointed" (2 Cor 1v21), "owned by God" (2 Cor 1v22). If I was to "be" these things and to "know what it was" for me to be these things, and to "know what I was capable of doing" because of who I am — wouldn't that be amazing! And the Bible has much more to say more about who we are in Christ — this is just the beginning of the list.

The one who epitomises what it means to "be" and to "know" who they are is of course Jesus. What does it mean for me to be like Christ (Christian) and have my identity rooted in Jesus Christ? I pray that we are encouraged, inspired and mobilised as we explore this together.

Focus on...

Peter & Rachel Calvert Serving with Perspectives and A Rocha France

Peter and Rachel, along with their daughters Anna, Sophie and Inès, live in Blois in the Loire Valley in central France. In the last couple of years they have moved away from the church planting that was their focus both in Blois and previously in Saint-Étienne into other areas of ministry.

Pete is continuing to provide pastoral support for a church in Romorantin, a town about three quarters of an hour away from Blois. He especially requests prayers for wisdom and love in dealing with occasional relational tensions and for his efforts to build up a network of visiting preachers willing to visit the church 1–3 times a year.

Pete is also involved in leading scouting activities and recently had fun looking after the younger (cub/brownie) section of a scout camp as well as the joy of helping 20 year old Jan Willem prepare two Bible talks (on the Israelites in the wilderness). Jan Willem is the son of two of their Perspectives colleagues and Pete and Rachel have known him for his whole life; he's now planning to start theological training with a view to serving as a pastor.

As well as scout camps, Pete is the director of the younger of two InterAction camps that take place in France each August (there are similar camps in Belgium and Germany). He's had this role for 5 years and been involved in the camps for longer. This year they had a team from Bushey Baptist Church (where Rachel's father was the pastor some years ago) helping them for the first time. They had a number of meteorological and medical complications to attend to (i.e. lots of rain and a variety of bugs and bangs) but the campers were very well behaved and the leaders' team worked together very harmoniously. They are now planning to launch a third camp in 2024 to increase their capacity.

Rachel's work at the moment is largely with A Rocha France (part of a wider network of Christian ecology / conservation organisations), where she serves as the chair of the board of trustees. This involves frequent visits to the south of France where their head office is based at Les Courmettes. Recently they held their annual training conference on the theme of "Living with Limits", with about 60 participants — a bigger group than in previous years, which was encouraging.



Peter and Rachel celebrated their 20th wedding anniversary in July, and the girls cooked them a lovely lunch to celebrate (see picture). In their latest prayer letter, Rachel thanked everyone who has been praying for them in those 20 years and noted that God has been faithful in answering those prayers.
