

Jesus — heavenly joy and inspiringly "Down to Earth"

It's so lovely to see all the Christmas lights starting to be switched on. It brightens up this time of year enormously. It's great to celebrate Christmas and I love joining in the fun. Christians are likely to be among the most joyful people at Christmas! However, I'm not suggesting vacuously hyping things up. The real joy is actually quite grounded. It's in Jesus who is wonderful, heavenly joy and is coming "down to earth".

Jesus is also a very "down to earth" saviour. He came down and stepped into the mess and detail of life on Earth.

Jesus shows amazing humility in his incarnation. He gives up eternity to embrace humanity. He gives up a place of honour to embrace rejection. He willingly gives up the safety and power of being enthroned to embrace the journey to the cross.

Then we look at the huge scope of his redemptive work on Earth. His redemption acted not only at his own time, millions who would come after him and millions who lived on earth before him in history are also redeemed through him. Also, it's not only humanity that is redeemed and given the opportunity of salvation, the whole of creation will be renewed. And not only in the physical realm, the work of Jesus has spiritual reach. On the cross Jesus wins an eternal spiritual victory.

Then there is the scope of his transformation. Jesus, although he is divine, isn't just for the great and powerful. His offer of redemption is open to anyone who will receive him. He doesn't then work only with and through those who are highly skilled. He gives gifts to all and works with the lowly and calls us all to be part of his work.

The LICC (London Institute for Contemporary Christianity — who prompted my reflections) have a reading plan to explore this more. They end by asking the question; what might it look like for us as individuals and for us as a church to go out into his world. Joining in his joy-bringing, down-to-earth mission?

Renew 57 is a space for the whole commmunity, on **Thursday mornings, 10:30am to 12:30pm in Canolfan Penrallt** (our rear hall/community centre), free of charge (including refreshments). A separate prayer space is available for quiet reflection, with optional opportunities to be led in short gentle contemplative prayer at the beginning and end of the session. Church Office

Foodbanks

Bangor Cathedral Foodbank (www.bangorfoodbank.org) is open 2 – 3pm every Monday, Wednesday and Friday, operating from Tŷ Deiniol (the Diocesan Centre) next to Bangor Cathedral. They are able to give people up to two emergency food parcels without a referral from another service. Tearfund is a Christian charity whose mission is to follow Jesus where the need is greatest, responding to crises and partnering with local churches and organisations to help people lift themselves out of poverty.

Thousands of people needlessly suffer and die every day because of poverty. But that's not God's plan for the world. And God is calling us – all of us – to reach out to people in greatest need.

For over 50 years, Tearfund has worked directly, and/or alongside local partners and churches, in underserved communities to tackle complex poverty in three main ways:
